DIRECTORS' REPORT

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I am pleased to present the Company's Audited Financial Statements along with Auditors' Report thereon for the year ended June 30, 2024.

1. FINANCIAL RESULTS:

2. NCPC MANAGEMENT AND OPERATIONS:

National Cleaner Production Center Foundation (NCPC) aims to introduce and promote Cleaner Production (CP) techniques for pollution prevention at source along with integrated waste management targeting sustainable development and community prosperity. It was established by United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) in 1999 with collaboration of United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), EPAs, Ministry of Climate Change (MOCC) and Ministry of Energy (Petroleum Division). It is registered as not-for-profit organization under Section 42 of the applicable Companies Ordinance, 1984 (repealed by the Companies Act, 2017) and is certified by Pakistan Centre for Philanthropy (PCP) and Federal Board of Revenue (FBR). Cleaner Production provides an integrated preventive environmental strategy to processes and products in order to reduce risks to human and the environment. Through the CP program, NCPC is bridging the gap between competitive industrial production and environmental concerns.

NCPC has established global linkages particularly with RECPnet (UNEP and UNIDO global network), China NCPC and other international organizations through meetings, training programs and other events.

The Company has partnership with different institutes and universities like Institute of Rural Management (IRM), Human Development Foundation (HDF), Pakistan Girl Guides Association (PGGA), Mir Chakar Khan Rind University of Technology, PMAS Arid Agriculture University, Government College University Faisalabad (Sahiwal Campus), Shaheed Benazir Bhutto University Sheringal, Mirpur University of Science and Technology, International Islamic University, Abbottabad University of Science and Technology, Pakistan Institute of Engineering and Applied Sciences, Sardar Bahadur Khan Women's University, Fatima Jinnah Women University, University of Engineering and Technology, Lahore College for Women University, Government College University Lahore, Bahauddin Zakariya University, National University of Sciences and Technology, Quaid-e-Azam University, University of the Punjab and Forman Christian College & University, for joint environmental protection, knowledge sharing and capacity building activities.

The company is carrying out broad categories of Environmental, Analytical, Energy, Waste Management Services (incineration, bioremediation and compositing), Capacity Building and Philanthropy Activities. Different Eco Model Projects regarding environment like Eco Model Villages, Societies, Oil Fields, Universities, Colleges, Schools, Madrassa, Churches, Mandirs, Hospitals, Streets, and Parks has been initiated.

The Company has expertise in providing quality services in the following areas:

a) ANALYTICAL SERVICES

Monitoring of stack emissions, waste and drinking water, ambient air, vehicular emissions, noise emissions and petroleum products analysis provided to multi sector organizations and industries by NCPC environmental laboratory, Attock Refinery Limited quality control laboratory and other certified laboratories like PINSTEC, PCRWR, PCSIR, Green Crescent, ESPAK and Target Lab.

b) WASTE MANAGEMENT SERVICES

The incinerators having capacity of 150 kg/hour to incinerate hospital, pharmaceutical and industrial waste are fully operational. The community as well as industry is being benefited through this facility.

The hazardous waste management services have been provided to various hospitals, labs and clinics, power plants, petroleum and gas sector, multinational Non-Governmental Organizations, food and pharmaceutical industries.

c) ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA), Initial Environmental Examination (IEE), Energy Conservation Audits, Hydrological Studies, Environmental and Social Monitoring, Trainings etc. under the category of Environmental Services have been provided to various sectors.

3. CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY:

a. CAPACITY BUILDING

Training sessions and Internship opportunity has been provided to the students and fresh graduates for their capacity building through eco internship program. Internship experience covers field activities i.e. Surveys, Risk Assessment, Environmental Studies, LCAs, Biodiversity Conservation, Environmental Monitoring, Environmental Awareness Campaigns in different segments of society like Universities, Colleges, Schools, Mosques, Madrassa, Mandir, Church, NGO's, Orphanages, Old Age Homes, Transgender Community etc. and office based activities i.e. Administration, Information Technology and Research for Development.

Internship opportunities have been provided to the wide range of students from the topranking Universities of Pakistan.

10. INTERNAL CONTROLS

The system of internal controls is sound in design and has been effectively implemented and monitored.

11. CERTIFICATION / REGISTRATION

After amendments in the Associations with Charitable and Not for Profit Objects Regulations, 2018, the need of renewing license under section 42 of the Securities & Exchange Commission of Pakistan had been abolished.

ISO 14001:2015 certification had been awarded to the Foundation on March 09, 2024 and Laboratory also got certification as Environment Laboratory on May 28, 2019 for next three years. Recertification process has been initiated. The Company has been registered with NEECA as Energy Audit Firm on July 01, 2023.

FBR has granted approval as Not for Profit Organization (NPO) under section 2(36) of Income Tax Ordinance, 2001 with effect from Tax Year 2022 for three years which is valid till Tax Year 2024.

12. DIVIDEND PAYMENT

No dividend is paid by the Company as it is a not-for-profit organization (NPO) incorporated under Section 42 of the applicable Companies Ordinance, 1984 (repealed by the Companies Act, 2017). Moreover, Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan also restricted distribution of dividend to members at the time of issuance of its NPO renewal certificate.

13. AUDITORS

The Auditors M/s. A. F. Ferguson & Co. Chartered Accountants retired and offered themselves for reappointment. The Audit & Finance Committee has recommended the reappointment of M/s, A. F. Ferguson & Co. Chartered Accountants as auditors for the financial year ending on June 30, 2025 on such terms and conditions and remuneration to be mutually decided.

14. AUDITORS' REPORT ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The Company's Independent External Auditors M/s. A. F. Ferguson & Co. Chartered Accountants have audited NCPC's Financial Statements and issued unqualified audit opinion stating that the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of affairs as at June 30, 2024.

15. OUTSTANDING GOVERNMENT PAYMENTS

All due payments of applicable taxes, duties etc. have been paid during the year except the normal and routine payments which have been paid subsequently.
